From the Building and Long-Range Committee

As we look forward to another great summer of camps in 2022, we can look at the projects which have been accomplished in the last couple of years, some of the challenges we have faced, and look forward to more improvements to be done at the camp to continue to provide a great ministry for the young people and families who grow closer to God in the beauty of the mountains.

On June 6, 2020 a derecho wind storm of unprecedented scale blew through our region bringing winds of nearly 100 miles per hour to Grand Mesa. Several volunteers were working at the camp that day and it was amazing to be in the middle of a storm of such proportions. Several trees blew down during the storm, one of which landed on one of the volunteer's vehicle, totaling it, another blowing down and taking the east entryway off the dining hall. Many other trees also blew down in the area causing roads to be closed and damaging several other vehicles, including one belonging to another volunteer who had been working at camp and had returned to his private cabin across the lake to eat lunch. All of the roads leading out from camp were closed by downed trees and people had to literally cut their way out to be able to go home. God's power is truly awesome, if a little scary to be in the middle of, but by God's grace none of our people were injured.

During the summer of 2020 we were unable to have youth camps due to COVID restrictions so we took the opportunity to do a major remodel and updating of the kitchen in the dining hall and repair the damage caused by the wind storm. We were able to replace the 1941 era walk-in cooler and add new stainless counters and tables, a new dishwasher, and increase the preparation space in the kitchen. We were also able to move the water heaters and other equipment from the kitchen area to a utility area we added to the outside of the dining hall. We also added a restroom to the back of the dining hall for the kitchen staff to use so they no longer have to take a long walk to the restroom.

All of this was accomplished through a great deal of volunteer time from a number of individuals, a grant from the American Baptist Churches of the Rocky Mountains which was funded through money which came from the closing of the Pueblo church and donations from several individuals. Pueblo had the foresight to stipulate how the funds from the sale of their assets would be distributed upon their closing and part of the stipulation was the funding of camping programs. This was a great help to Grand Mesa Christian Association and WYOBA Camp in Wyoming. I would encourage all of the churches related to the camp to consider similar planning.

As always there seems to be a never-ending list of things which need to be repaired, replaced, upgraded, and improved at the camp and we will be working on more of these projects this summer as finances allow.

A few examples of project which we need to accomplish in the near future include (in no particular order):

- ⇒ Replace the underground electrical wiring which supplies power to the boys cabins and boys restrooms
- ⇒ Repair of the boys restroom building which has structural issues caused by snow and old age (ultimately it would be best to replace the building but repairs to the existing one will extend its usable life by several years while funding can be found)
- ⇒ Replacement of the underground wiring to the girls cabins, restroom, and recreation hall
- ⇒ Repairs to the craft hall to maintain it and extend its life
- ⇒ Upgrades to a lot of the trails, etc. to make access to the areas of camp easier for people with mobility challenges. This may include adding steps down to the camp fire area, etc.
